1. Report Summary:

- 1.1. This report introduces the Revenue and Capital Budget Monitoring Reports of the Council for the period 1 April 2021 to 30 June 2022 (Quarter 1).
- 1.2. The Budget Monitoring Reports, attached at Appendix 1 (Revenue) and Appendix 2 (Capital), summarise the financial position as at 30 June 2022.

2. Key Statement Features - Revenue:

- 2.1. The budget monitoring reports for the first three months of the financial year show that the Council is managing its income and expenditure within budgetary expectations.
- 2.2. Increased revenue expenditures have resulted in a £40k overspend on budgets as at the end of quarter 1. This has materially arisen from:
 - Insurance premiums of nearly 80% increase over the prior financial year - 3 full market tender exercises have been completed over the last 5 years and each has been increasingly harder to find receptive insurers due to the very thin rating in the parish council sector; this has been coupled with the sector resetting of costs following 10 years of no rating increases.
 - Structural and scaffolding costs arising from the criminal damage caused to the Poultry Cross in May; Councillors should note that these costs should be recoverable under the council's insurance policy.
 - Tree surgery costs arising from storm damage clearance during April, and ash die back.
- 2.3. Increased revenue income has resulted in an £80k over recovery on income targets as at the end of quarter 1. This has materially arisen from:
 - Increased cremation and other crematorium services generating approx. £40k of income over profiled target.
 - Guildhall bookings and other activities have resulted in a £34k over recovery over profiled target.

- 2.4. The net effect of the increased revenue expenditure and increased revenue income, is a net favourable variance of £37k.
- 2.5. The profiled expenditure revenue position for core functions as at 30 June 2022 is:

- 2.7. The revenue budget monitoring statement at **Appendix 1** has been profiled, where applicable, to reflect activities which do not occur on a regular monthly basis such as the precept, grants received, loan repayments and commercial property leases.
- 2.8. Note: Councillors are asked to note the CCTV budget includes £27.5k of allocated CCTV staff costs; the remaining costs of £15.2 are funded via the Establishment staffing budgets.

3. Key Statement Features - Capital:

- 3.1. The capital budget monitoring statement at **Appendix 2** has been profiled as costs are incurred; this is because funding for capital is project based.
- 3.2. As at 30 June 2022, £30k of the £807k capital budget has been spent. Capital receipts of £26k in respect of Community Infrastructure Levy payments have part offset these capital costs to leave a £4k net expenditure.
