1. Report Summary:

1.1. This report introduces a draft Litter Bin Policy for approval. so that all requests for new litter bins are evaluated against a policy criteria.

2. Background:

- 2.1. Salisbury City Council has over 300 litter bins located across the city. Whilst the Council is committed to providing sufficient litter bins to help discharge its responsibilities under the Environmental Act 1990, the City Council does not have an extant policy for agreeing the provision and siting of litter bins.
- 2.2. The Council regularly receive requests for additional litter bins which is often not the solution to a specific problem. In future, it is proposed that all requests for new litter bins are evaluated against the policy criteria so that they are only located in areas where it can be demonstrated that there is a genuine need.
