### 1. Report Summary:

1.1. This report gives details of the Community and City Grants awarded since 1 Apr 2021.

#### 2. Background:

- 2.1. The Council agreed that £25,000 would be allocated for Community Grants 2021/2022.
- 2.2. There are currently two types of Community Grant available;
  - 2.2.1. Minor Grant Scheme designed for organisations that require a modest amount of funding for a project which can be completed within one year and which will benefit the local community of the Salisbury City Area. The maximum amount available under the Minor Grant scheme is £500.
  - 2.2.2. Medium Grant Scheme an innovative funding stream ideal for organisations which may wish to carry out longer term projects. Under the Medium Grant scheme organisations may apply for a grant from £500 up to £3,000 for up to 3 years
- 2.3. Full details of this Grant Scheme are available on SCC's website.
- 2.4. In 2021 the community grants were considered by the Community Working Group in accordance with the Grants Policy, as agreed by Finance and Governance Committee in July 2019.
- 2.5. Salisbury City Council (SCC) also distribute funds through the City Grant Scheme. This scheme funds projects or one off events which would not be eligible for funding from other SCC grant schemes. This is an unfunded scheme.

- 3.1. Performance data for those awards made in this calendar year is not yet available as most of these projects are not yet completed and will be reported at future meetings.
- 3.2. The applicants for Medium Grant awards in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year have supplied data relating to their performance against their stated aims in order to receive the second year of funding. This information to councillors is available upon request and has been reviewed by the Communities Working Group.

### 4. Grants Budget 2021/22:

- 4.1. The Council are potentially committed to award £20,250.00 during the remainder of 2021/22, leaving a balance of £4,750.00 for new applications.
- 4.2. Feedback from conversations with previous applicants who do not currently hold a grant has been that £500 is a very small amount in relation to the costs of most activity. Those considering an application (three groups) found that small projects were meeting the medium grant threshold and that they were exploring how to grow their project and apply for a larger sum.
- 4.3. New Grant applications for the remainder of the year will be considered on 1 Mar 2022.

### 5. Grants Budget 2022/23:

- 5.1. The Council are potentially committed to award £12,000.00 during the remainder of 2022/23, leaving a balance of £13,000.00 for new applications, if similar budget allocation is agreed by Council in 2022/2023.
- 5.2. The Grants Policy is currently under review by the Communities Manager, for discussion with the Communities Working Group on the 18 Jan 2022. Any amendments to the policy would be applied to the 2022/23 financial year.
