To discuss a precept cap of 5% on future Salisbury City Council budgets, and obligation to call a parish meeting if an administration wants to increase the precept by more than 5%.

2. Poll

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1992 Schedule 12 the person presiding at the meeting, or at least ten electors, or one third of the electors present, whichever is the less, are required to demand a poll. The officers of the council will record the name(s) of those demanding the poll in the minutes of the meeting.

The parish meeting does not vote on whether or not to have a poll once this call has been made. The meeting does, however, vote on the question to be put in the poll. The proposer of the poll question must have their name and address recorded by the clerk for the meeting.

The chairman of the meeting should ensure that the question can be voted for either 'yes or 'no', and the question must not be vague or lend itself to double-negative. Once the wording of the question has been agreed by the meeting it cannot be changed.
