Markets

- The market has really picked up over the past few months, with trader and footfall numbers increasing week on week.
- Tuesdays seem to have been particularly good over the past 2 weeks.
- We have had a significant increase in new traders approaching us to trade, as apposed to us having to go and source new traders. These include some really high quality new food vendors and a new jewellery seller.
- Pitch fee consultations with the traders have now concluded. On the whole these were positive, with some good feedback and suggestions from traders to be worked on.





Markets

- Our first street sellers market is due to take place in May, which is dog/pet themed. We have had a good level of applications for this, many of which are different from last year.
- There has been a big push on making sure that invoices are paid well in advance of the street seller markets, and also in chasing up charter market arrears before the end of the financial year.
- We have made some good progress at the new depot, undergoing lots of tiding and organisation to make it easier to store and access the equipment that we need for markets and events.



The Guildhall Salisbury

Guildhall

- The Guildhall has had a busier Q4 than previous years and already has a large amount of bookings for 2023-24 lined up.
- A newly agreed programme of maintenance has begun and will see much needed refurbishment take place around the building over the coming year, predominantly around the entrance. This is important both in improving our aesthetic to clients and public, but also in protecting the fabric of the building.
- The Guildhall's Wedding Fair was March 26 with more exhibitors - and more attendees - than the past years.

Information Centre

- The Information Centre has been busy these past 3 months.
- Continues to be the front face of the City Council answering calls and enquiries from local residents as well as taking allotment and Fixed penalty notice payments.
- Selling tickets for the Stonehenge Bus Tour and Blue Badge Guide walking tours as well as tickets for Studio Theatre productions and The Scout Panto. We also sell Stamps, Radar keys, Books about Salisbury and Maps of the surrounding area and showcase local produce: Jams, honey, Utta Nutta Peanut butter, My Trusty Vit E products and Cyrils Goats Milk Soap. A recent addition is the Spitfire Range of Books, DVD's and coasters.
- We have sold 234 Mortlock guides and 196 Her Salisbury Footprint Trails as well as handing out free maps to the many hundreds of National and International Tourists that visit our lovely City.
- Produced a Mini Guide for travellers and have sent 700 to the Cruise Info Point at See Southampton.
- Customer Service Manager Cindy retires on the 31st March 2023 and Vicky Goodwright will be taking up the reigns on the 1st April 2023



Shopmobility






The back wall of Shopmobility has been redesigned to reflect the service on offer in keeping with the new City marque and branding.




