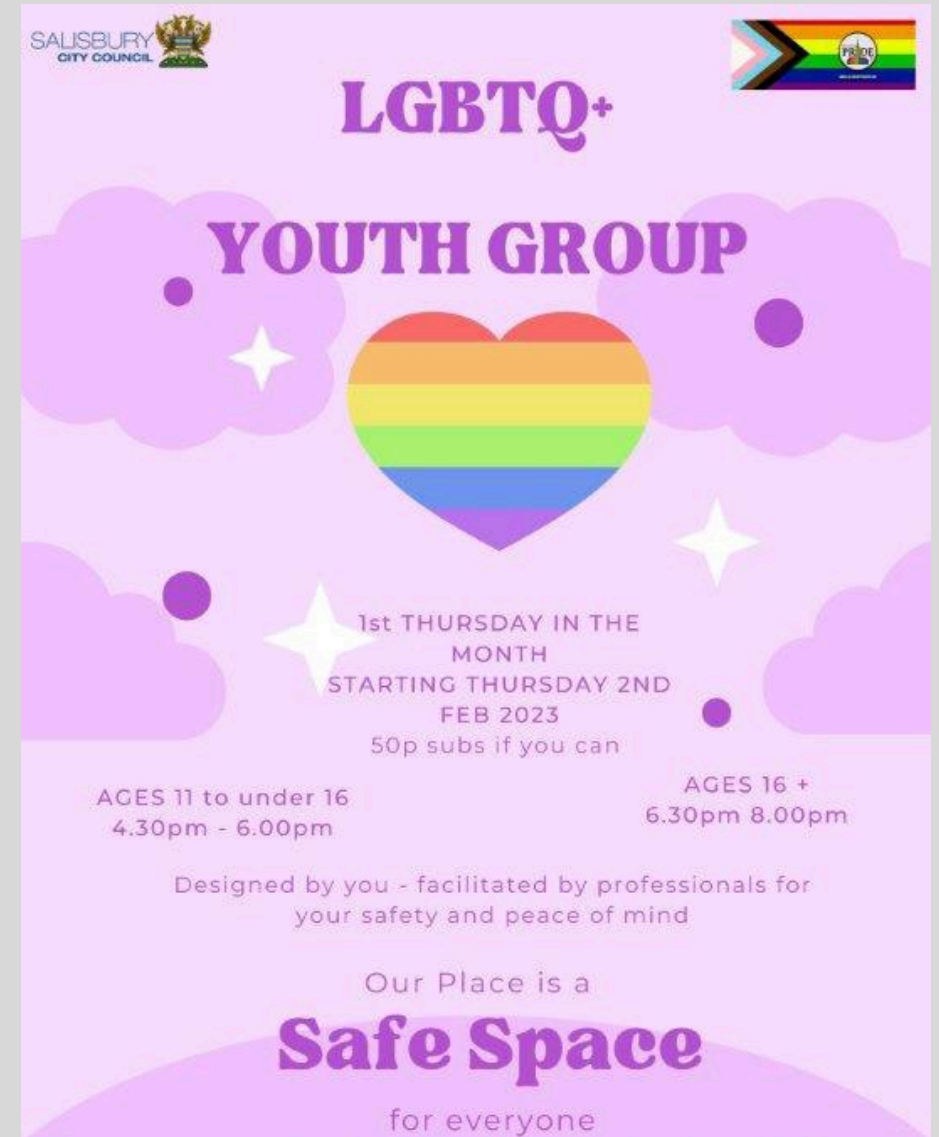
- Supporting the committee to plan for meeting with local Businesses

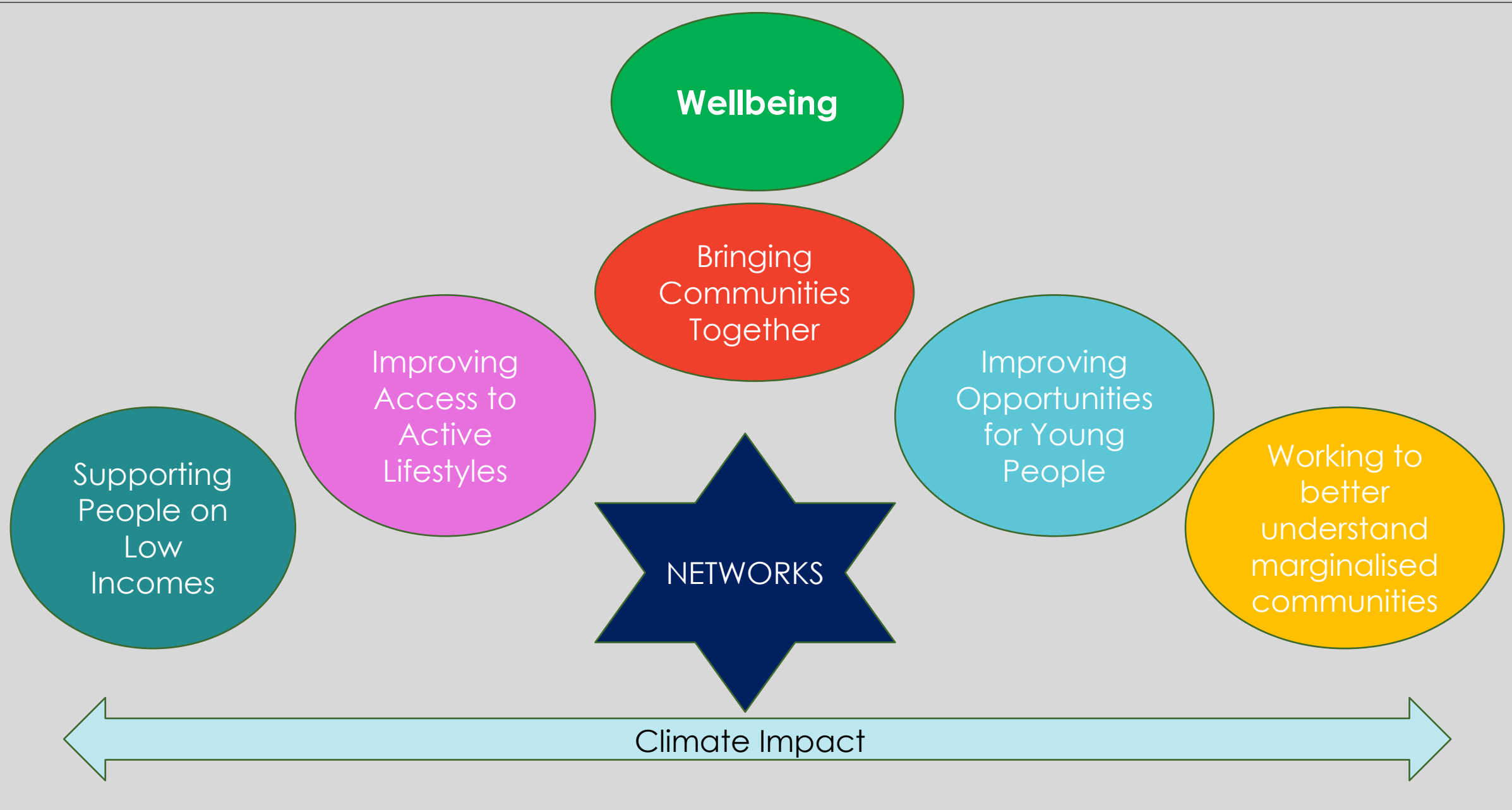
