### 152 log book entries.

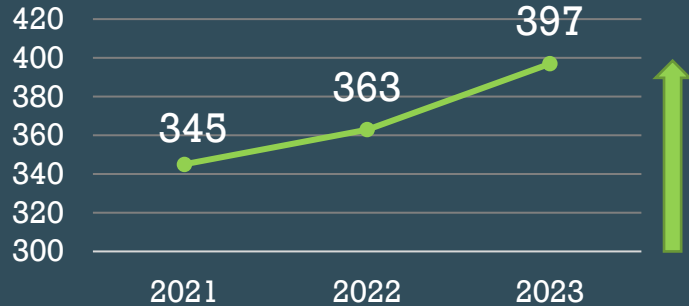

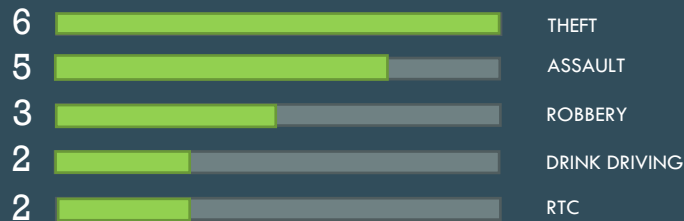

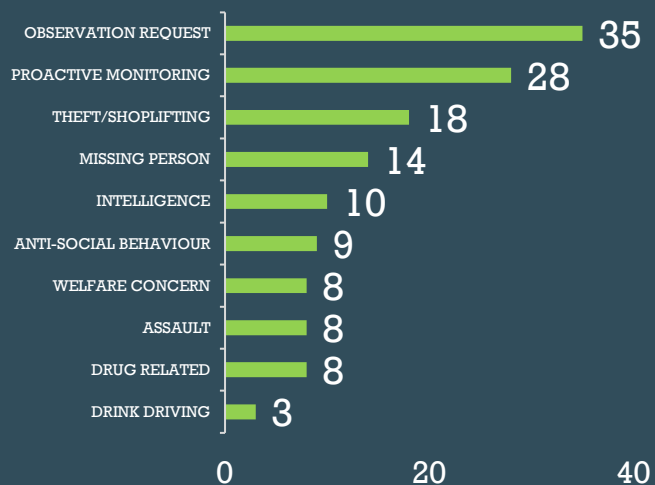
#### HOURS WORKED IN JANUARY

### 138 log book entries.

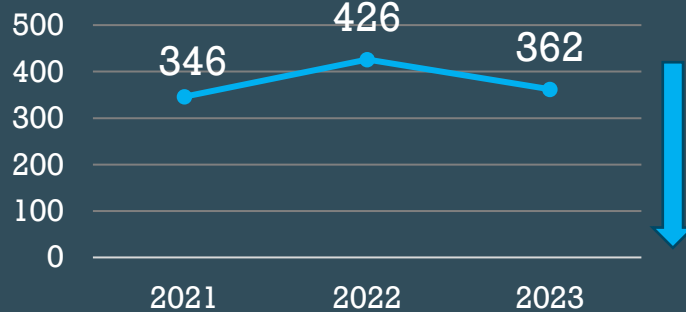

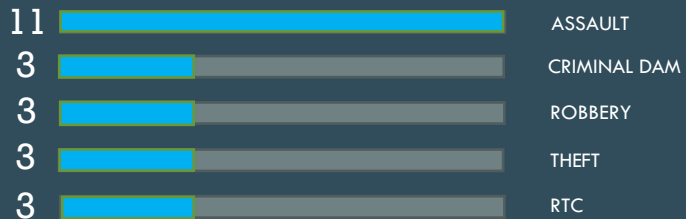

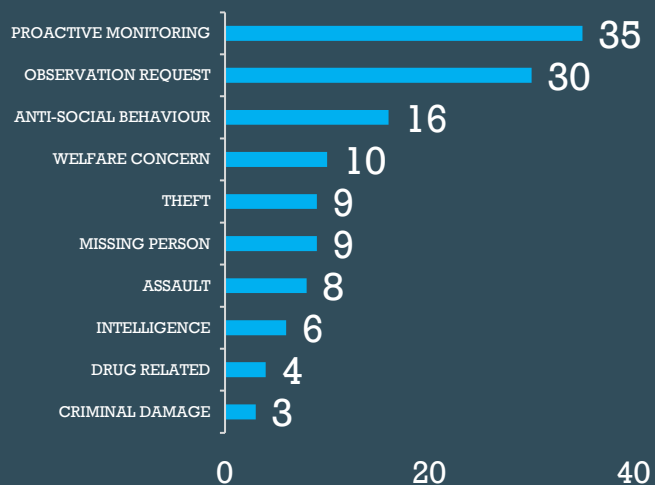

### 125 log book entries.

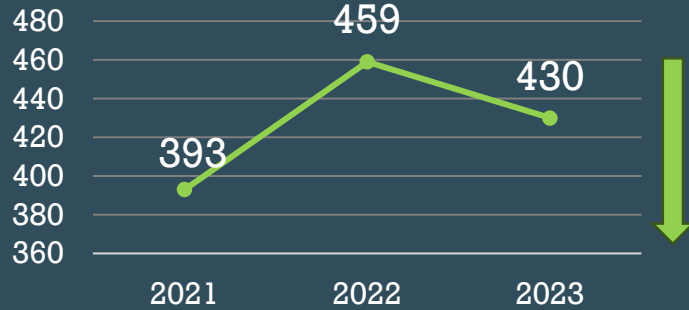

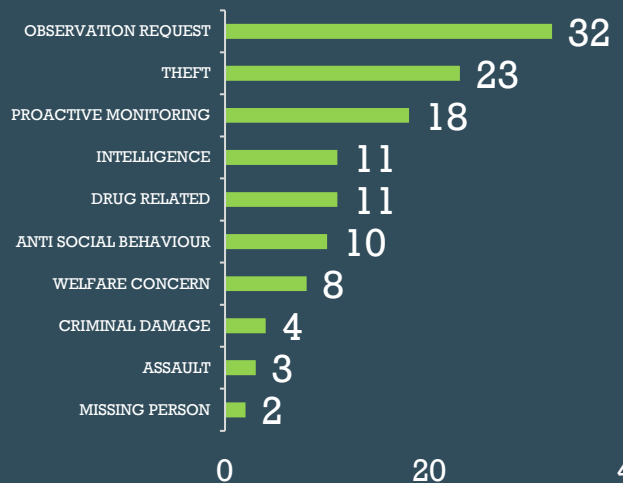

#### 189 log book entries.

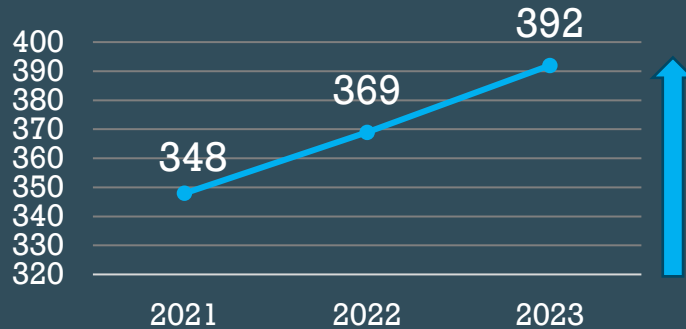

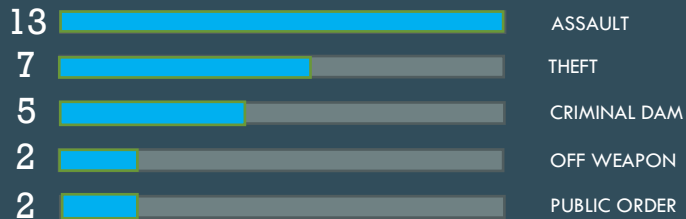

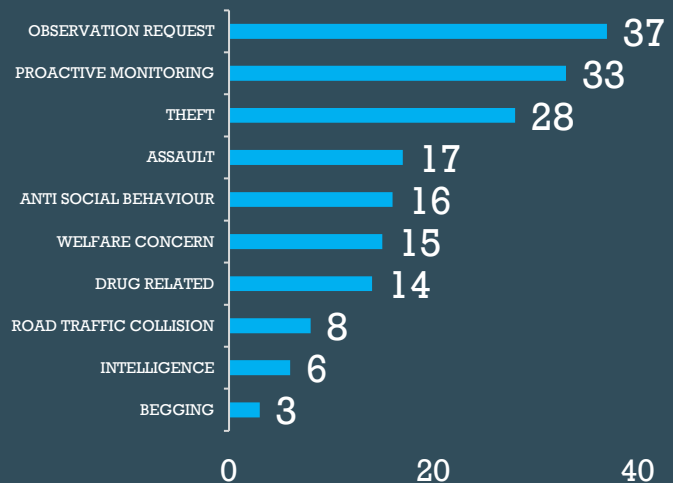
