1. Report Summary:

- 1.1. This report details four new streets which require naming as part of the development of St Peters Place, Fugglestone Red, Phase B3
- 1.2. Wiltshire Council are obliged to get authorisation from the town or parish council to agree suitable names before a formal application and associated documents are submitted.

2. Background:

- 2.1. The developer has put forward the suggestion of:

Road 1 = Twynnoy Drive (Hannah Twynnoy (c1670-1703) Hannah was a servant at the White Lion Inn, Malmesbury. She has the unfortunate claim to fame of reputedly being the first person in Britain to be killed by a tiger. A travelling circus arrived at the inn and Hannah unwisely taunted the captive tiger which managed to catch her and tear her to pieces. A memorial stone can be found in Hullavington Church).

Road 2 = Talbot Drive (William Henry Fox Talbot (1800-1877) Fox Talbot lived in Lacock and was a pioneer of photography. His picture of the latticed window in Lacock Abbey (taken in 1835) is the earliest known paper negative in existence. He was an accomplished scientist and a member of the Royal Society. In 1831 he represented Chippenham as a Whig in the reformed parliament of 1832).

Road 3 = Hyde Road (Edward Hyde, 1st Earl of Clarendon (1609-1674) Born in Salisbury, Edward was grandfather to Mary II and Queen Anne. He was chief advisor to the exiled Charles II. In 1660 he was made Baron hyde of Hindon and in 1661 he was made Earl of Clarendon. Edward eventually fell out of favour with the king and fled to France. He died in exile in Rouen but his body was returned to England where it was buried in Westminster Abbey).

Road 4 = Seymour Road (Jane Seymour (c. 1508 – 1537) Jane Seymour was Queen of England from 1536 to 1537 as the third wife of King Henry VIII. She was born at Wulfhall in Savernake Forest, Wiltshire.
