Grant Request	<p>Dennis Marsh House Management Committee are responsible for the premises and grounds with regards to its financing, maintenance and providing a safe environment for all its users.</p> <p>Although it is the HQ building for Scouting in the district it also provides meeting accommodation for a wide variety of organisations. Users of the premises include Sarum Swords (fencing club), Allotment Gardens Association, Brito Kung Fu, Sarum Ki Aikido Club, Peacock Therapy (one to one therapy sessions for young children), Meta Tango (Argentinian tango dance lessons), Back in Line (line dancing), Breathe (breathing exercises for young children with medical needs), Model Club, Mini Athletics (toddlers exercise) Sarum Trefoil (Girlguiding), Polish Community Women's Event, Muslin Women Exercise Group and Mums and Toddler Exercise Group. Polish and Indian wedding receptions have been held. The building is designated a Rest Centre by Wiltshire Council for use in emergencies and is used as a Polling Station.</p>
£3000	Brief Description of Project
Type of Grant	Description: Dennis Marsh House Capital Improvements, our Headquarters building needs work done to improve safety at the location, to remedy a water ingress in the porch area following heavy rain and to improve overall appearance.
Medium	<p>Beyond the fire exit door from the kitchen the ground steps down and then up after about 10 feet. This needs to be levelled up using paving slabs and gravel to prevent possible trips and crush should the building need to be evacuated in an emergency.</p> <p>Additionally, work is required to a pedestrian entrance. It is narrow and the ground there is uneven and adjacent fencing is broken down. It is desired to move it a short distance from one side of the vehicle</p>

		<p>entrance security barrier to the other and to make it level, wider and therefore accessible.</p> <p>The perimeter fence and hedge in other areas is also broken down in places and needs attention.</p> <p>A 1100-litre wheelie bin is situated near the front entrance to the building and is located on uneven ground adjacent to a path to the front door. We propose to provide a hard standing and shield it from the path, by fencing to improve the security from and of the waste and visual effect on the area.</p> <p>A ground access cover in the car park has broken foundations causing it to sink below ground level causing a 'pot hole' and a trip hazard.</p> <p>Water egress into the porch area presents a slipping hazard.</p> <p>Aims and Objectives</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) To ensure that safety matters are addressed for the benefit of all users of the premises. 2) Improve overall appearance of the location to show that it is a properly maintained and cared for location not just to the users but residents and passersby thus ensuring good feeling and wellbeing.
