<p>We are Quidhampton residents and Bemerton St John is our local school. To walk to school, obviously with young children, there is no safe route to get to school. We walk on the road (as there is no pavement) on a bend into incoming traffic. When we do arrive at school, cars have blocked the pavement immediately outside of the school car park so we are forced to continue on the road with cars coming and going from 'spaces'. Cars do not always obey the 20mph speed limit so we feel incredibly vulnerable on our walk to school.</p>

What would you like done to resolve this issue?	
<p>A pavement or at least improvement so that cars are aware that there are likely to be pedestrians on the road. There are plenty of nettles/brambles sticking out too which add to the walk but if they were removed then there could actually be space for a small pavement. Traffic lights / Somebody employed by the council to be controlling traffic at this busy time could be an option? Road markings to signal some kind of path!? It is incredibly dangerous. The car park is full, parents park along the road where they are not allowed to, usually blocking the bus.</p>

Location of Issue:	Bemerton St John School, Lower Road
Community Area:	Salisbury

Nature of Issue:	
<p>Lower Road between Bemerton Farm and St John's Primary School has no pathway for pedestrians wishing to walk safely facing oncoming traffic. There is a short length of pathway on the other side, but no continuous pathway along that section of narrow dangerous road. It is used by 2 risk groups, the elderly from the Bemerton Farm Residences and the young children and parents walking to and from school. Parents with their preschool toddlers and school aged children have to walk in the road.</p>	
How long has it been an issue?	We moved here in 2019 but I understand well before then.
What would you like done to resolve this issue?	
<p>An elevated pathway should be built along the side of the Lower Road Bemerton between Bemerton Farm and the Primary School, situated on the river side of the road. Clear road signage in place to warn drivers of vulnerable pedestrians and possibly traffic calming to reduce speed. Warning lights for School operative during peak times of use along this section of road. Clearance of brambles and other vegetation overgrowing the walking area.</p>
