1. Report Summary:

1.1. This report introduces applications from the six organisations currently benefitting from the Sports and Social Club Rent Reduction Scheme who wish to continue with this benefit.

2. Background:

- 2.1. The Council allows sports and social clubs operating from buildings and land it owns to pay a reduced rent, significantly below the market value in exchange for undertaking activity which has a community benefit.
- 2.2. At the Finance and Governance Committee in July 2018 (minute 529.2 and 529.3) it was agreed that the scheme would be managed under the Grants Policy.
- 2.3. Under the Grants Policy, Sports and Social Clubs are required to make an application to be part of the scheme, and are then required to complete a satisfactory annual report in order to remain part of the scheme.
- 2.4. The Communities Team have offered applicants support and guidance to allow them to complete the application forms as fully as possible.

3. Sports and Social Clubs:

3.1. The sports and social clubs in the table below are in receipt of peppercorn rent.

Attending the Unit can help boost self-esteem and confidence, in the past the Unit has hosted two young people who had been in trouble and were wearing electronic tags, both claimed they wanted to change. Sometime later as a result of their efforts and the support of the Unit the club were able to submit a report to the courts via the Probation Service and both tags were removed early. These two cadets went on to become value members of Sea Cadet Adult Staff. The team were recently approached by two cadets who had just passed their apprenticeships in Mechanical Engineering requesting permission to establish a new Marine Engineering Workshop in the Sea Cadet Unit, and realising the list of tools and equipment were expensive, the unit managed to convince the Regional Manager of Halfords that this was a worthy cause and gained sponsorship to equip the ne Marine Engineering Workshop
