**Subject**: Re-adoption of the General Power of Competence

### 1. Report Summary:

1.1. This report requests a resolution to renew the General Power of Competence (GPC).

### 2. Background:

- 2.1. The GPC was introduced as part of the Localism Act 2011, sections 1-8 which became effective in July 2012.
- 2.2. Parish Councils no longer need to ask whether they have a specific power to act or do something. The GPC (LA 2011 s1(1)) gives local authorities, including eligible local councils, "the power to do anything that individuals generally may do" as long as they don't break other laws. It is a 'power of first resort' which means that when searching for a power to act, the first question to ask is whether you can use the GPC.
- 2.3. This was a change to the manner in which Parish Councils ordinarily worked and speeds up opportunities to be more flexible and innovative in their approach to providing public services.
  - 2.3.1. There are two eligibility criteria which must be met in order for a Council to adopt the GPC:

A minimum of two-thirds of Councillors must have been elected

- 2.3.2. The Clerk must hold the Certificate in Local Government Administration (CiLCA) 2012.
- 2.4. SCC fulfils both these criteria and, if it so wishes can determine, via a Full Council resolution, to adopt the GPC.
- 2.5. SCC first resolved to adopt the GPC at a Full Council meeting on 23 July 2012 (minute 210 refers).
- 2.6. The power was then re-adopted at Full Council on 3 June 2013 (minute 289.2 refers) and again on 5 Jun 2017 (minute 723.1-723.2 refers). The adoption only lasts however for the term of that Council, hence why it must be renewed now that an election has taken place.

#### 3. Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Council:

3.1. Declares that it meets the conditions, prescribed in Article 2 paragraph 2 of The Parish Councils (General Power of Competence) (Prescribed Conditions) Order 2012 (SI2012/965), and hereby resolves to adopt the General Power of Competence as provided in the Localism Act 2011 ss1-8. This declaration has effect until the Council's Annual Meeting 2025.
