| <p>The residents of number 40 suggest adding clear white centre-lines so that cars correctly keep to their side of the road.</p> <p>Number 40 would also like to be able to park in front of their driveway, which they cannot do because yellow lines extend up to their drive, presumably because of the possibility of over-speed cars.</p> <p>With that extra context, I would like to suggest some kind of obstacle that force vehicle speed reduction at the curve.
