Issue Details

Location of Issue:	Barrington Road
Community Area:	Salisbury

Nature of Issue:	
<p>There are 2 issues on our road. 1 is the poor quality of the actual road surface, there are several large cracks and potholes, in places the old road beneath is visible. Vehicles passing over the damaged areas, especially the large modern cars, lorries, buses (drivers under instruction use this road regularly) and vans, all of whom often pass at high speed, cause vibrations in the houses...see below...</p> <p>The second, and probably more urgent issue is the complete lack of speed limit signs and ineffectual traffic calming measures. Barrington Road is used by many vehicles and very few, including lorries delivering to the Onestop Shop, observe the 20mph limit. The raised areas are now of no real use, most cars are too large to be bothered by them, most people don't even slow down any more. The only indication of the 20mph limit on this road is at the junction with the London Road. At that point there is another road (Seth Ward Drive) joining from the right and immediately to the left is the entrance to the Crematorium. The attention of a driver is not, and probably should not be on the road surface which is where the limit is painted, it's a busy junction most of the day. Once past this point, there are no more speed limit signs. Barrington Road has become a bit of a rat run with cars cutting through from Castle Rd to the Aldi on London Rd. It is particularly busy in the mornings and afternoons when very many school children walk along our street heading to and from the schools in Laverstock; the cars take no heed of their presence at all.</p>	
How long has it been an issue?	It has got steadily worse over the 11 years we've lived here.
What would you like done to resolve this issue?
