Issue Details

Location of Issue:	The junction at Park Lane and Castle Road, Salisbury
Community Area:	Salisbury
Parish or Town Council:	Salisbury City Council

<p>Residents of Park Lane have raised concerns regarding the junction and the safety of those trying to exit from Park Lane onto Castle Road. This is due to a number of issues:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Drivers are unaware of the junction- The yellow lines at the junction are faded and cars regularly park illegally on the corners whilst visiting the Co-Op shop located on Castle Road. These need to be re-painted as a matter of urgency.- There are bollards in place to prevent people parking but these are also not in a good state of repair and need to be replaced. I have asked at the Co-Op shop if the bollards are their responsibility, but nobody was able to confirm. Could Wiltshire Council support in ensuring that whoever is responsible actually takes responsibility? <p>Please see images below.</p>

<p>Improved signage regarding the junctions in this area of Castle Road (Park Lane, St. Francis Road and Waters Road) Repainting of yellow lines (I understand that this is the best time of year to do this due to the weather) Replacement/reinstatement of bollards.</p>

<p>Residents of Park Lane have expressed concern regarding the safety of those using the junction and those using Castle Road. This is a particularly busy area with the Co-Op shop, three junctions and a traffic light pedestrian crossing, in very close proximity. Drivers on Castle Road can be travelling at speed between the junctions and when cars are parked illegally the visibility of those trying to leave Park Lane is very much reduced. Residents report regular 'near misses' and are fearful of a serious accident occurring. The problem is increasing as the volume of traffic increases.</p>
