Fayre on the Square

- Good feedback on layout this year, some comments received said it was the best one so far
- New bar was received very well, with good feedback on their stage area
- Columbia bar happy with their return, food retailers found this year down on previous years
- Total costs (including staff salaries) £56k compared to £49k in 2024.
- Total income £44,500 compared to £43k in 2024
- NB South Western Rail did not sponsor this year meaning £7.5k less in sponsorship

- Excellent Level of bookings continues into Q2. The Guildhall is very busy for the remainder of the year, with 78% occupancy booked until Christmas 2025.
- We have exceeded last year's (record) Q1 income.
- We are continuing to progress ticketed events with bar service. Bar design for permanent solution in progress.
- An evening with the Mountaineer Simon Yates, Mark Dawson's newest book launch, and a trio of comedy nights are all booked in. Jan, May, September. Jan tickets on sale end of October.
- Progress continues too with a signing in/out system that will improve the safety and security
 of the Guildhall and people within.
- Signage next phase . London Road. Application ready to be submitted end of October.

- Shopmobility attended the 'Men Matters' event at Salisbury City Hall on Tuesday 16th September 2025 to promote our service and to attract volunteers to help us run this vital service
- Shopmobility had 1327 hires in the period July Sept 2025 (daily hires and long-term hires)
