The Problem



The State of UK Rivers


- Only 14% achieve good ecological status.
- 0% reach good chemical status.

Hampshire Avon

- A globally protected river.
- Still fails Environment Agency & Natural England targets.

Public Risk

- 1 in 6 have tried wild swimming.
- 55% of those became ill (Surfers Against Sewage).
- 52% are afraid to enter rivers due to water cleanliness concerns.



The Solution

Bathing Water Designation

- Monitors for harmful bacteria/viruses.
- Legal pressure on polluters to clean up.
- Empowers the public with data for informed decisions.

Benefits

- Safer recreation.
- Accountability for polluters.
- Drives infrastructure upgrades.

Queen Elizabeth Gardens

Why QE Gardens?

- Popular with families and children.
- Likely to meet DEFRA's site suitability criteria.
- Shallow area ideal for designation.

No conflict with existing use

• Avoids deeper water used for angling downstream.





Application Process

Who Applies?

- Typically led by local authorities for coastal sites.
- Inland designations often led by communities.


