The former Carwardine's establishment is an established and successful business. In recent months the premises has been running a succession of Temporary Event Notices to operate into the Late Night Economy with no adverse impact or footprint with the Responsible Authorities. Following a recent inspection visit and discussion with the Licensing Authority and Police, this application is submitted with an Operating Schedule containing a raft of robust conditions contained to promote the Licensing Objectives.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

ICCTV:

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped.

Recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format.

The Recording equipment and data storage shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.

An operational weekly log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Police on contact number 101 immediately.

INCIDENT LOG:

An incident log must be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police, which must record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

STAFF TRAINING:

All bar staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any other equivalent recognised training.

Training records shall be kept on the premises and shall be produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), the Police or an authorised Trading Standards of the Council on demand.

SIA.

SIA registered Door Staff shall be employed on a risk assessed basis. Risk Assessments shall be recorded in writing and made available to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police. PUBWATCH:

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS shall be active members of any local PubWatch supported by the Council and Wiltshire Police whilst such a scheme shall be in operation. 'Active' membership includes 75% attendance at local PubWatch meetings and a ready acquiescence to and participation in all initiatives promoted through the Scheme.

ASK ANGELA:

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS shall implement the Ask Angela initiative (or similar) whilst such a scheme shall be supported by the Council and Wiltshire Police.

c) Public safety

No risk to public safety identified at this time.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

GOOD NEIGHBOURLINESS:

Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to neighbours or residents.

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall be displayed at all exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

e) The protection of children from harm

AGE VERIFICATION:

The premises shall operate Challenge 25.

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any counter advertising the scheme operated.

REFUSAL REGISTER

A written register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required Identification to prove their age or have failed to meet the sobriety standard. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and will be produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), the Police or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of the Council on demand.

The only acceptable form of identification shall be a Passport, Photo Driving Licence or Proof of Age Standard Scheme card carrying the PASS hologram.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

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PAYMENT DETAILS
