## 1. Report Summary:

- 1.1 This report details eight new streets which require naming as part of the development of Wilton Gate Phase 3 on Netherhampton Road, Harnham West.
- 1.2 Wiltshire Council are obliged to get authorisation from the town or parish council to agree suitable names before a formal application and associated documents are submitted.
- 1.3 It has been requested that 10 names be submitted in case any are deemed unsuitable or unusable.

## 2. Background:

- 2.1 At the Planning and Development Committee meeting on 21 July 2025, following a request from a member of the public, it was agreed that the names from the World War I War Memorial in Salisbury may be considered for use as street names.
- 2.2 Officers submitted a list of names taken from the WWI memorial and the Book of Remembrance at St Thomas's Church. These were approved for use by the Planning and Development Committee on 21 July 2025 and it was recommended that the first 18 names were used initially.
- 2.3 Consent must be sought for use of any living person or for any deceased person who has been deceased for less than 50 years.
- 2.4 The list of names from the WWI memorial are provided in Appendix A.
- 2.5 Previously used street names are provided in Appendix B.

## 3. Recommendations

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Committee select 10 names from the first 18 on the WW1 memorial list to be submitted to Wiltshire Council for use in the street naming of Wilton Gate Phase 3 on Netherhampton Road, Harnham West.
