**Subject**: Treasure Trail Engraving – Proposal for Market Square Installation

# 1. Background:

- 1.1. A local resident has created a heritage-themed treasure trail in Salisbury, which is promoted via the Information Centre. The trail engages residents and visitors through an interactive series of clues, revealing stories of the city's history.
- 1.2. To complement this, the resident has designed a permanent engraved artwork, which doubles as both a directional link to the trail and a standalone piece of outdoor public art. The proposer seeks a suitable location to display the engraving in Salisbury, with a preference for Market Square given that the trail begins there.



## 2. Proposal Summary

- 2.1. Install the engraved artwork in the Market Square area, potentially using existing black metal brackets on the underground toilet block flower beds.
- 2.2. The artwork would be secured via chain and designed to complement the surroundings without obstructing access.
- 2.3. The piece is intended as both public art and functional signage, enhancing the look of the space and encouraging participation in the trail.
- 2.4. The piece is intended to be a semi-permanent fixture, but the Council reserves the right to remove at any time.

#### 3. Officers View

- 3.1. The proposal aligns with the Council's aims to promote cultural engagement, heritage awareness, and city centre vibrancy.
- 3.2. The initiative is led and delivered by the resident, with no anticipated cost to the Council. Officers note the artwork's dual role as public art and as a promotional asset for the trail, which is already an established city centre activity supported by the Information Centre.

#### 4. Rationale for Location

- 4.1. The Market Square is the natural trail starting point.
- 4.2. The proposed site is currently underused aesthetically, and the artwork could enhance its appearance.
- 4.3. The location is highly visible to residents and visitors without obstructing movement or commercial activity.

## 5. Benefits

- 5.1. Adds to Salisbury's cultural offer and enhances city centre appearance.
- 5.2. Supports local businesses by driving additional footfall (businesses can opt into trail offers flexibly).
- 5.3. Provides visitors with an engaging, family-friendly activity linked to heritage.
- 5.4. Delivered at no cost to the Council.

#### 6. Implications

6.1. **Financial:** No cost to the Council. All installation and maintenance costs to be borne by the proposer.

- 6.2. **Legal:** Permission and agreement terms would need to be set, ensuring clarity on responsibility and liability.
- 6.3. **Environmental Impact**: The proposal has minimal environmental impact. The piece is passive artwork requiring no utilities.
- 6.4. **Equalities Impact:** The artwork will be accessible and visible to all. The trail activity is open to residents and visitors of all ages and abilities.

## 7. Recommendations

- 7.1. It is recommended that the Committee:
  - 7.1.1. Notes the proposal by the resident
  - 7.1.2. Considers whether the Market Square is a suitable location.
  - 7.1.3. If minded to support, authorises officers to engage with the proposer to agree detailed terms for installation, maintenance, and responsibility including reserving the right to remove at anytime.
