**Resolved to:**

841.1. Note and thank the Royal Military Police for their Service and Commitment to the City of Salisbury for over 100 years.

841.2. Award the Freedom of the City to the Royal Military Police, with the right, privilege and distinction to march through the Streets of the City of Salisbury on all ceremonial occasions with swords drawn, bayonets fixed, drums beating, bands playing and colours flying.
