- 1282.3. 18/05405/FUL SCC objects to this application due to overdevelopment of the property, which is overbearing on the street scene and too close to the highway.
- 18/06747/FUL SCC notes that the applicant provided insufficient information with regards to the proposed development. SCC asks that the applicant clarifies; how many people are they expecting to provide education for; how many fire escape exits will the facility have; how they are planning to reduce the potential noise-footprint; how many toilets will the facility have; and, how they are planning to mitigate potential traffic congestion issues.
- 1282.5. 18/06720/FUL SCC notes that the development could cause potential overbearing of the street scene.
- 18/06692/VAR SCC strongly objects to this application. The Committee notes that development will have a negative impact on the cleanliness and amenity of the area of the city. The applicant cannot provide any history of compliance with its own operating procedures to support an extension in opening hours. The Committee views this application as an incremental change in the previous which could set a damaging precedent. Furthermore the application is opposed by local residents.

The Committee requests Wiltshire Council to strongly reinforce previously agreed planning conditions and further requests that Wiltshire Council require to the applicant to conduct noise level surveys including internal noise surveys in neighbouring properties. The Committee also suggest that the applicant is reminded of their responsibility to ensure their external areas, including their shop front, is kept in a clean and litter free condition.
