Public Statement

Ms Emily Richards

Dear Councillors,

I live in the new development in West Harnham off the A3094. My partner and I moved here in March of this year.

Since moving to West Harnham, we have been especially concerned by the number of HGVs and other lorries that use the A3094, often exceeding the speed limit of 30 mph in the residential area. We cycle or walk into town nearly every day, as we prefer not to drive if it is not necessary, but are finding this increasingly dangerous.

Between the One Stop Shop at Norfolk Road and Wilton, the A3094 has no pedestrian or cycle crossings, despite the new housing (and the planned new housing). This is very worrying. In particular, although Upper Street is a recommended quiet route into town for cyclists and pedestrians, connecting with the Town Path, there is no crossing to enable safe crossing from the south side of the A3094 to Upper Street. Crossing the road can often take as much as five minutes and is often dangerous even when it appears safe as cars and lorries often come up very quickly - often speeding - and visibility can be poor due to parked cars or vans on the pavement. Although the walking route along the Town Path is well used, I rarely see any pedestrians using the pavement on the A3094 and when we do meet other pedestrians - who are often elderly or still at school age - they are obviously also experiencing problems crossing the road safely.

Once in the town centre things are no easier, as large numbers of HGVs drive through the town centre rather than using the ring road. This seems to have increased recently and I am particularly concerned at the number of HGVs and car transporters crossing Crane Street bridge, again often at speed. It is noticeable that lorry drivers often deliberately avoid the ring road, with its known congestion, and use the inner city roads instead. This is dangerous, environmentally harmful and contributes to the high levels of air pollution in the city centre, besides having the capacity to badly damage the city infrastructure.

I would like to request that:

- The prevalence and speed of lorries on the A3094 and in Salisbury City Centre is checked regularly and measures put in place to prevent lorries and cars speeding

- Measures to enforce the use of the ring road for lorries coming off or going to the industrial estate at Churchfields
- A pedestrian crossing is put on the road at the point where it intersects with Upper Street so that cyclists and pedestrians can cross the A3094 safely to access the quiet route into town.

I do not feel safe as a cyclist or pedestrian in Salisbury, which is extremely sad as it is an ideal city for walking and cycling in terms of size.
